Copies have just been received at this office of a bulletin from the state agricultural experiment station, giving the results of experiments in growvariety tests made in 1905 to 1908 inclusive. The report shows the varieties which were found to be best for different purposes, such as early market tubers; medium maturity, heavy yielding varieties; heavy yielding, late varieties; stock-food varieties, etc. It also contains a very complete discussion of the methods of improving the yield of potatoes by seed selection. Results of the experiments show that it is possible to increase the yield of the more common varieties more than 30 per cent by careful selection of seed for two successive years. A brief summary of the methods of planting. cultivating, harvesting, and marketing the crop, which have been found to give best results in farm practice throughout the state is included in the bulletin. 
