Frederick II of Anhalt. Frederick II, the reigning duke of Anhalt, was born August 19, 1856, the son of the late Duke Frederick, whom succeeded on the throne in 1984. Anhalt is a duchy of the German empire, and is almost surrounded by Saxony. The area is less than thousand square miles and the popul lation is about 300,000 nearly all protestant. Anhalt began to be an ndent principality in the first half of the 13th century. It has been repeatedly, in the course of its history divided among branches of the reign-ing family. It was divided into three duchies in the beginning of the 17th century, but the first line becoming extinct in 1874, and the second in 1883 the whole territory was reunited into one duchy. 
