MILTON COLLEGE FUTURE BRIGHT

LARGE FRESHMAN CLASS TO BE ENROLLED.

Indications for Milton Institution Encourage the Officials.

Milton, Sept. 6.—When Columbia college opens its doors for the coming year on September 12 an enrollment of at least 30 in the freshman class is expected. According to H. S. Shangle, financial secretary of the institution never have inquiries been so numerous and requests for rooms and board come in so far ahead of the opening of the school as has been the case this year.

The new president, Dr. James Crutchfield who has already left his former home in Phoenix, Arizona, will arrive in Milton tomorrow, September 7th. Mr. Crutchfield comes to the local institution with a brilliant record back of him. He is, beside being an educator of considerable prominence both in the east and west, a strong factor in the political and social life of the community in which he lives. He was chosen one of 52 men who drafted the recently adopted constitution of the new state of Arizona and had a prominent part in forming every sentence of this document.

Dr. Patton, charged with obtaining money under false pretenses and a vocalist of more than ordinary attainments, served as musical director, while "Big Slim," the well known bronco buster, was among the leading voices in the bass department.

After finishing with "thinking of the old folks at home," the group of prisoners evidently became more hopeful, for they passed to "Oh, what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer."

Other songs of a religious nature were then taken up one by one. The impromptu concert lasted more than an hour.
