TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 9th day of February, 1909, creating improvement district No. 17 and designating Jefferson avenue, as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 30th day of August, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Jefferson avenue in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon cement sidewalk, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of the south side of Jefferson avenue, from the west curb line of Chestnut street, to the east curb line of Fourth street.

The north half of block 115, Chaplin's addition to the town of La Grande, Oregon.
