ROBERT EAKIN LOCATES HERE
SON OF CHIEF JUSTICE IN LAW FIRM NOW.

The young man's sterling qualities and his inherited inclinations toward the discipleship of Blackstone made it possible for him to be graduated from Dr. Holman's institution with high honors.

MISS PEEBLER IMPROVES

INFANTILE PARALYSIS VICTIM IS MUCH ENCOURAGED.
 Parents and Chiropractor Confident of Final Recovery.
 Genial little Miss Helen Peebler, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. T. Peebler of Ladd Canyon is wearing a still broader smile these days because her parents and attending chiropractor, G. T. Darland, see such rapid improvement in her condition that they predict she will be able to walk ere many months have elapsed. Miss Peebler is the 12-year-old Ladd Canyon girl who over a year ago was stricken with infantile paralysis and since then has been unable to walk a step. Her right hand is also slightly affected by the dreaded malady.
 Today she can almost straighten both knees and encouraged by the signs of improvement the family is sanguine over permanent recovery. The little girl has been the object of sympathy from everyone acquainted with her physical condition.

Long Arrow Flights.
 There was a marvelous archery feat performed some years ago by Sir Ralph Payne Gallwey on the links at Le Touquet. Shooting with a Turkish bow, he covered a distance of 367 yards with his best arrow, thus breaking all records achieved in recent times. This performance, however, seems to have been exceeded with the old national weapon of yew. Needs, a famous archer under Charles I., states that the ordinary range of the bow was from 320 to 400 yards. The longest shot authentically recorded in England is that of a secretary of the Turkish embassy, who in 1794 shot an arrow 463 yards with the wind and 415 against it in the presence of several members of the Royal Toxophilite society, who measured the distance and preserved the arrow.—Pall Mall Gazette.
