### NOTICE OF STREET IMPROVEMENT TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon on the 5th day of August, 1909, creating improvement district No. 1, and designating Adams avenue as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 6th day of September, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of Adams avenue, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon cement sidewalks and macadamizing, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made, that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of Adams avenue on north side from the west line of Alder street, to a point 200 feet west of Alder street.

(A) And the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows:

The property owned by the Grande Ronde hospital, described as follows: Commencing at a point 60 feet west of the southwest corner of block 14, of Grandy's second addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon, running thence west 380 feet to the west line of the southeast quarter of Section 6, Twp. 3, S R 38, E W M, thence north 212½ feet, thence east 380 feet, thence south 212½ feet to the place of beginning.

STATE FAIR WAS SHORT IN MANY WAYS THIS YEAR.  
Dr. Charlton Returns From Regular Visit to the Event.

At least one man from La Grande always visits the state fair. That man is Dr. P. A. Charlton who takes a deep interest in the live stock business and development of the state.

Returning today from the state capital after staying through the fair week the doctor expressed a slight disappointment in the displays and were empty, the fruit display was ordinary and not so extensive, the counties of the state failed to make their usual exhibits and in the pavilion cheap jewelry stands were permitted to run in full blast. Machinery hall was better than ever but this one attraction was probably the only one that took the advance step while all other features seemed to be on the decline.

The racing was handicapped by weather which no one could prevent, but at that some good time was made and the racing was not bad by any means.

"It means," said the doctor, "that something new must be injected into the fair. The time has come when people demand different amusements and they will not take the old time interest in products and an ordinary fair."
