MOURNERS KISS
GREEK CORPSE

GREEK CATHOLIC PRIEST IS BROUGHT FROM PORTLAND.

Service Replete With Rites and Chants in Sober Tribute to Dead.

Orthodox Greek Catholic funeral services were carried out here yesterday afternoon when John Kairis, a Greek, was buried from the Henry & Carr undertaking parlors, with services in the chapel. Kairis, a drowned at Perry Sunday. A Greek Catholic priest was here from Portland to officiate at the services, and the local members of the Greek colony paid their ritualistic respects to the memory of the dead with a great deal of fervor.

Corpse Kissed by All

As is the custom in the Greek Catholic church, the remains are kissed by mourners and friends alike, just before the remains are taken to the cemetery. This is the second time in recent years that a Greek funeral service has been held here, but this is the first time that the full ritualistic rites have been applied. While facilities were not of the best, the audience was able to carry out much of the impressively service. The chants were chanted and the songs were sung. All mourners and friends carried burning tapers and the show of oriental pomp in the tribute program rather surprised J. J. Carr, the undertaker in charge. At the grave the casket was again opened and rites similar in many respects to those enacted at the chapel were gone over again.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 15th day of December, 1909, creating improvement district No. 13 and designating North Fir street as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 20th day of September, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of North Fir street, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon macadam roadway, cement curb and drainage, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows:

All that portion of North Fir street, from the south curb line of Monroe avenue, to the south line of U avenue.

(A) And the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows:

The west $\frac{1}{2}$ of block 149, 151, 154 and the east $\frac{1}{2}$ of blocks 150, 155 and the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of block 125 and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of block 124, Chaplin's addition and the west $\frac{1}{2}$ of block 24 and 23 and the east $\frac{1}{2}$ of block 2 and the east $\frac{1}{2}$ of Fredmore block, Fredmore addition, all in La Grande, Oregon.

the council will levy a special assessment on all the property affected and benefited by such improvement for the purpose of paying for such improvement. That the estimated cost of such improvement is the sum of \$6,432.50.
