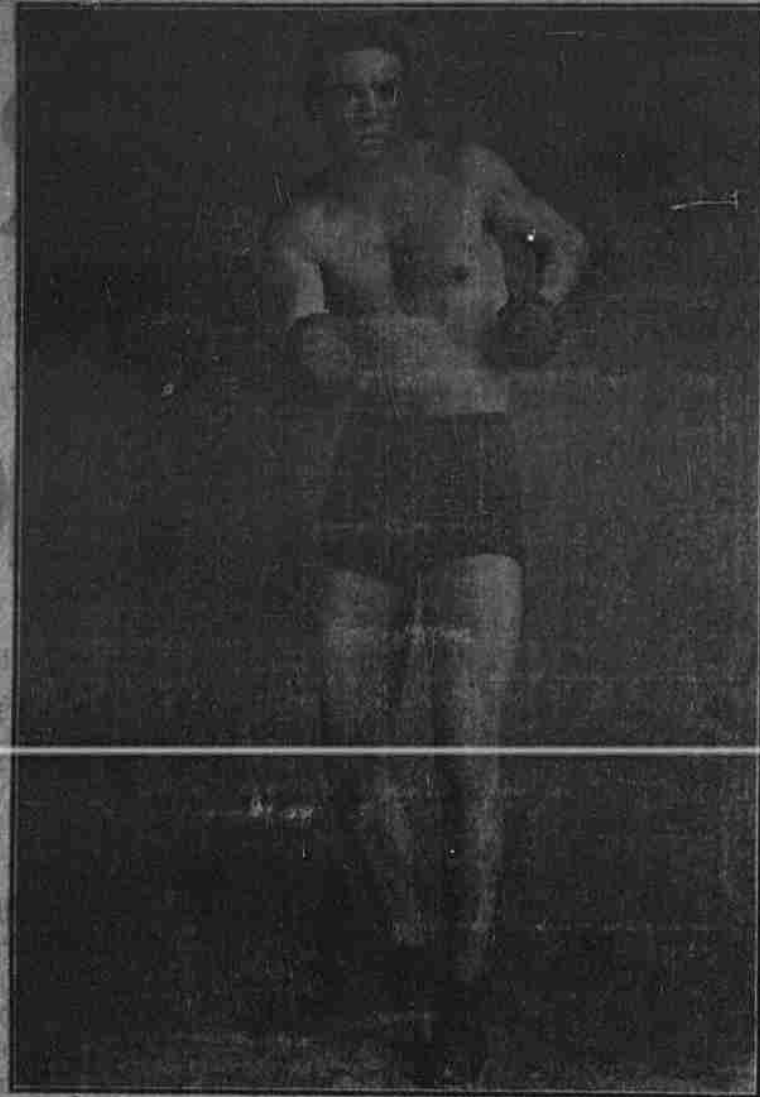

## COVE BOOSTERS THANK FRIENDS

### COMMERCIAL CLUB ENDORSES PORTLAND RESOLUTION

First Club Meeting Since Cherry Show Held This Month.

Cove, Sept. 29.—(Special)—At a meeting of the Cove Commercial club, held on the above date, this being the first since the Cherry fair, the following resolutions were passed:  
"Resolved, That, as the Cove Cherry fair was a success both socially and financially, we wish to thank the good people of Cove and of Union county, for their co-operation; we especially wish to thank those taking part in the program, the Ladies guild, for the use of the grove, T. H. Elson, for his leadership in building and decorating the pavilion, and above all, we wish to thank Roy Conklin for the very able way in which he, as general manager, made it a success."

A resolution was also passed endorsing the resolution adopted by the Portland Commercial club, and the chamber of commerce, which are as follows:

"Whereas, it is the plan of the United States government, to invite the nations of the world to join the American fleet on its passage through the Panama canal on its official opening in 1915, and proceed to the bay of San Francisco to participate in the grand opening of the Panama Pacific International exposition to commemorate the completion of that great engineering feat; and

"Whereas, the battleship Oregon, which was built at the Union Iron works, San Francisco, by the brawn and sweat of our patriotic workmen, and christened Oregon in honor of this great state and subsequently given the title of the "Bulldog of the Navy," by reason of the wonderful achievement of steaming 14,000 miles from ocean to ocean, and arriving in the waters off Santiago in time to participate in the historic sea fight that ended our troubles with Spain; and,

"Whereas, the attention of the whole world was centered on the remarkable voyage of the Oregon, and emphasized the necessity of constructing the Panama canal, not only for defensive purposes, but commercial as well.

"Therefore, It is resolved that the

Commercial club of Portland and the Chamber of Commerce of this city, join with the Panama Pacific International Exposition delegation now present, and pledge themselves to use their utmost endeavors to prevail upon the federal government to do fitting honor to the battleship Oregon by naming her the ship of war to lead the navies of the world through the Panama Canal, and further be it Resolved, that we pledge ourselves to call upon our delegation in congress to use every effort to bring about the fulfillment of the desires of the people of the states of California and Oregon and of the nation. Cove Commercial club, H. C. Rees, secretary."
