NEXT WEEK TO BE TAKEN UP WITH BIG FAIR

Interesting Races Go to Help Make Enterprise Fair Big One.

Enterprise, Sept. 29.—(Special)—The program for the Wallowa county fair which opens here next Monday has been announced as follows:

Monday.
Devoted to installing exhibits.

Tuesday.

Forenoon—10:30, band concert.

Afternoon—1:00, band concert 2 3-mile relay race for mules, 3 mules to the string. Purse, \$75. Divided 60 per cent, 30 per cent, 10 per cent. 2:30, one-quarter mile dash, free for all. Purse \$50. 3:00, cowboys' saddle horse race, purse \$30. Ed Berland contest for best gentleman rider, prize \$12.50 pair of spurs. R. L. Day contest for best lady rider, 1st prize \$10, 2nd prize \$5. Motorcycle race 1 mile for E. M. & M. company prizes, 1st prize 25.20 Winchester carbine, worth \$16. 2nd prize \$5 pair of shoes.

On each afternoon, between races, the Oriental Ben Abdies, genuine bedouins of the desert, will give grand free exhibitions, "The Sports of the Dervishes," consisting of acrobatic and balancing feats and a thrilling slide for life.

Wednesday.

Forenoon—Judging of livestock, starting at 9 o'clock. Band concert, 10:30.

Afternoon—1:00, band concert. First day of relay race, purse \$300, divided 60 per cent, 30 per cent, 10 per cent, race to be 15 miles, 5 miles, per day for 3 days, each entry allowed five horses. 2:30, three-quarter mile novelty race, free for all, purse \$75, \$25 to horse leading at 1/4 mile, \$25 to horse leading at 1/2 mile, \$25 to horse leading at 3/4 mile. 3:00, trotting race, 1 mile, free for all Wallowa county horses, best two heats in three, purse \$100. Association's contest for best driving team owner to drive, 1st prize \$15, 2nd prize \$7.50. Sports of the Dervishes and slide for life.
