THEIR COMBS HOTEL ROOMS

STEALS SUIT CASE AND FILLS IT WITH VALUABLES.

Later Capture in Railroad Yards With Goods on and Near Him.

Stealing a suit case from a room in the Foley hotel occupied by Miss Gene MacIlroy and Miss Mamie Rasmusson, both of Elgin and filling it with valuables brazenly stolen from various rooms on the same floor of the hotel. Gerge Davis, a negro from the east, last evening, unsuccessfully executed one of the most daring robberies of recent months in this city when he loaded himself with all the valuables he could find, slipped down the fire escape and for a time successfully eluded the hastily formed posse. It was between 6 and 7 o'clock last evening that Mr. McAllister, a traveling salesman stopping at the Foley, saw a negro carrying a suit case trying to effect an entrance to a room from the hallway. McAllister made inquiries and the negro replied he was looking for the landlady. McAllister apprised the hotel office of his discovery and P. A. Foley hastily went to the floor but found no one. At the same time, without any reason except probable instinct, Day Clerk E. J. Poulson stepped to the rear of the hotel. He saw a negro drop from the fire escape and make, pell mell, for the railroad yards. A small posse set on his trail but no one was found for a time. Officers Brady and Whitman finally arrested the fellow, coolly sitting on a box car.

Goods Scattered Far.

The valuable taken from the hotel were deposited for safe keeping hurriedly of course, in three box cars, in Davis' pockets and in the suit case. So far as known, everything taken has been recovered.

He was lodged in jail and this forenoon information was filed against him and he will likely be bound over to the grand jury by Justice of the Peace Williams.

FOOD BURNED BY DEALERS

MAYOR RUSHLIGHT, PORTLAND, AFTER MEN.

To Keep Prices Up, Wholesalers Are Said to Have Burned Food Stuff.

Portland, Sept. 29.—Mayor Rushlight has joined the movement for a public market under the city's control today following the publication of figures showing that 54,000 pounds of foodstuffs were burned in the incinerator in ten days, by commission men.

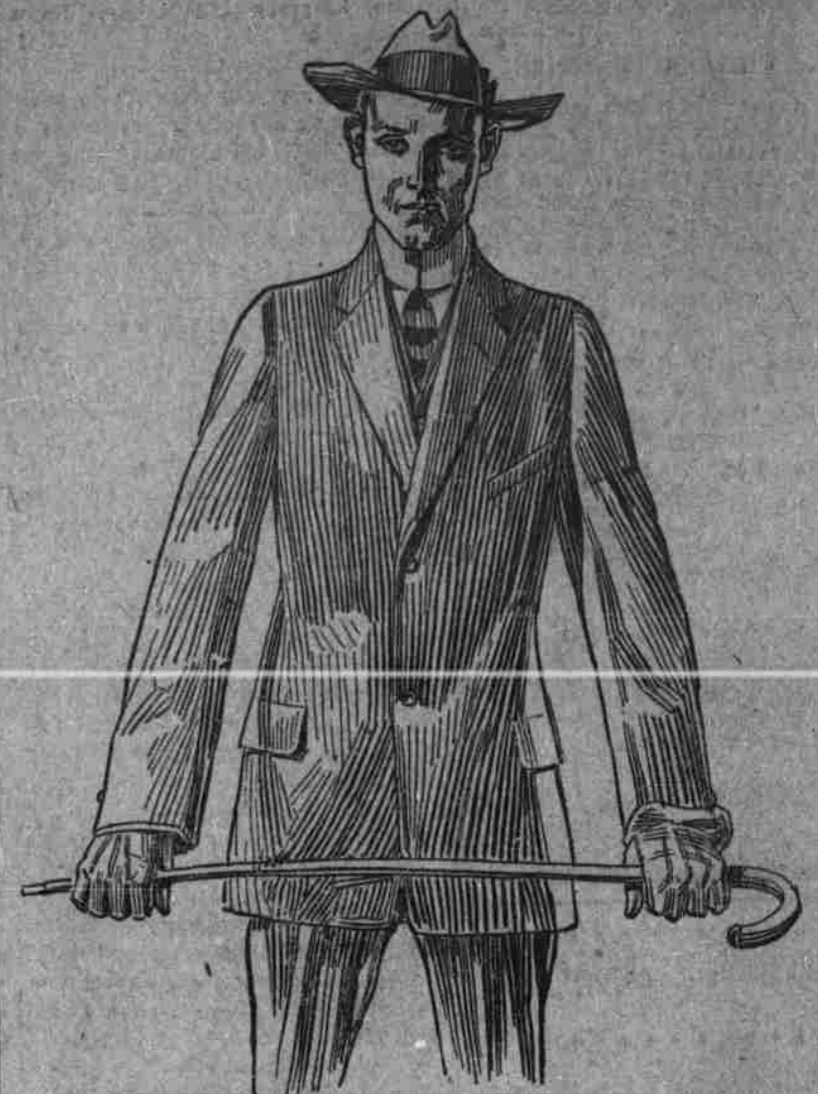
It is charged that this immense amount of food was burned to keep up the market price and it is understood that a complaint will be made to the grand jury now in session asking the jury to investigate the commission houses to ascertain whether they are operating in restraint of trade.

Much of the food burned was spoiled, but those in position to know, declare that commission men allowed it to rot rather than place it on sale below the market price, which it is alleged they have been in the habit of agreeing on and sticking to, no matter how much the market was glutted.
