"GRABBING" OF TRIPOLI WITHOUT
EXCUSE.

IS INDIAN.

"Flower of the Ranch" Is Proud of
Fact That Mother Was an Indian.

A half breed of the Sioux Indian is Miss Betty Caldwell, who is playing the part of "Flower" in the musical comedy, "The Flower of the Ranch," coming to the Steward tomorrow night.

Miss Caldwell was born in Oklahoma territory 19 years ago. Her mother was a full-blood Sioux, her father a white man who was one of the first to stake a claim when the strip was opened up in 1889. They lived on the ranch for nearly 14 years and then sold it and moved to Kansas City, where the father was engaged in the live stock business. This change brought about splendid opportunities for an education, of which Miss Caldwell made the best. In a recent interview regarding herself and the part of "Flower," Miss Caldwell has the following to say:

"Oh, I am so glad that my mother was an Indian, for the older I grow, the more I realize that the North American Indian is fast becoming extinct, and I have a feeling of love for the race and, in fact, I really believe that every true American down in his heart has a feeling of deep regret when they realize the crushing defeat that the red man has experienced; yet I realize it is all for the best, for I can see both sides as I travel about in this great country. There is one thing that I notice, and that is the attention that is sometimes shown me, for the Americans and Canadians are alike in their curiosity to meet me, simply because I am a descendant of the Indian; and so few are in the theatrical profession. It seems that in the part of 'Flower' I actually live and breathe the ranch atmosphere. It gives me a longing for the level plains to be there riding a bronco, helping the cowboys during the round-up, and to mingle with the wild steers. Yet I like the part of 'Flower' and hope that I shall play the part for seasons to come."
