"Three blacksmiths, six helpers, one machinist, one machinist helper, one boiler maker helper, one painter, one rough carpenter, two car carpenters. Between six and 10 common laborers are employed about the shops."
The strikers meet at 9.30 every morning at the I. O. O. F. hall to hear reports.

Indiana to Supply Exhibits.

DAVIDSON IS GIVEN VERDICT

JURY FINDS FOR PLAINTIFF IN UNION CASE TODAY.

Validity of Mortgage Involved in Suit Now Before the Court.

Finding for the plaintiff in the sum of \$450 the jury which heard the opening case of the present term of court, the case being that of T. W. Davidson vs. Brown, a Union dispute, this afternoon disposed of the first case. The case involved money matters over a note. The case went to the jury this morning, the verdict being reached a few hours afterwards.

Effort to Save "Big Bill" From Prison.

Boston, Mass., Oct. 3.—The most important case on the docket of the United States circuit court which convened for its regular session today is the appeal in the case of "Big Bill" Kellher, who is under sentence of 18 years in state prison for complicity in looting the national city bank of Cambridge. Kellher, who is equally well known to the sporting fraternity of New York and Boston, is alleged to have obtained through the medium of fake faro games the bulk of the \$350,000 stolen from the bank by Cashier Coleman. It is expected that the case will be reached by the court before the end of the week. While awaiting the result of his appeal Kellher has been confined in the East Cambridge jail, being unable to secure \$50,000 bail.

Trusts Must Agree.

New York, Oct. 4.—Bringing agreements from four of the biggest trusts that they will either re-organize or disintegrate, Wickersham arrived here today. He will return to Washington next week. The trusts to submit are the electrical, powder, harvester, southern wholesale association. It is confidentially stated that the steel corporation may re-organize. Wickersham is busy with the re-organization plans.
