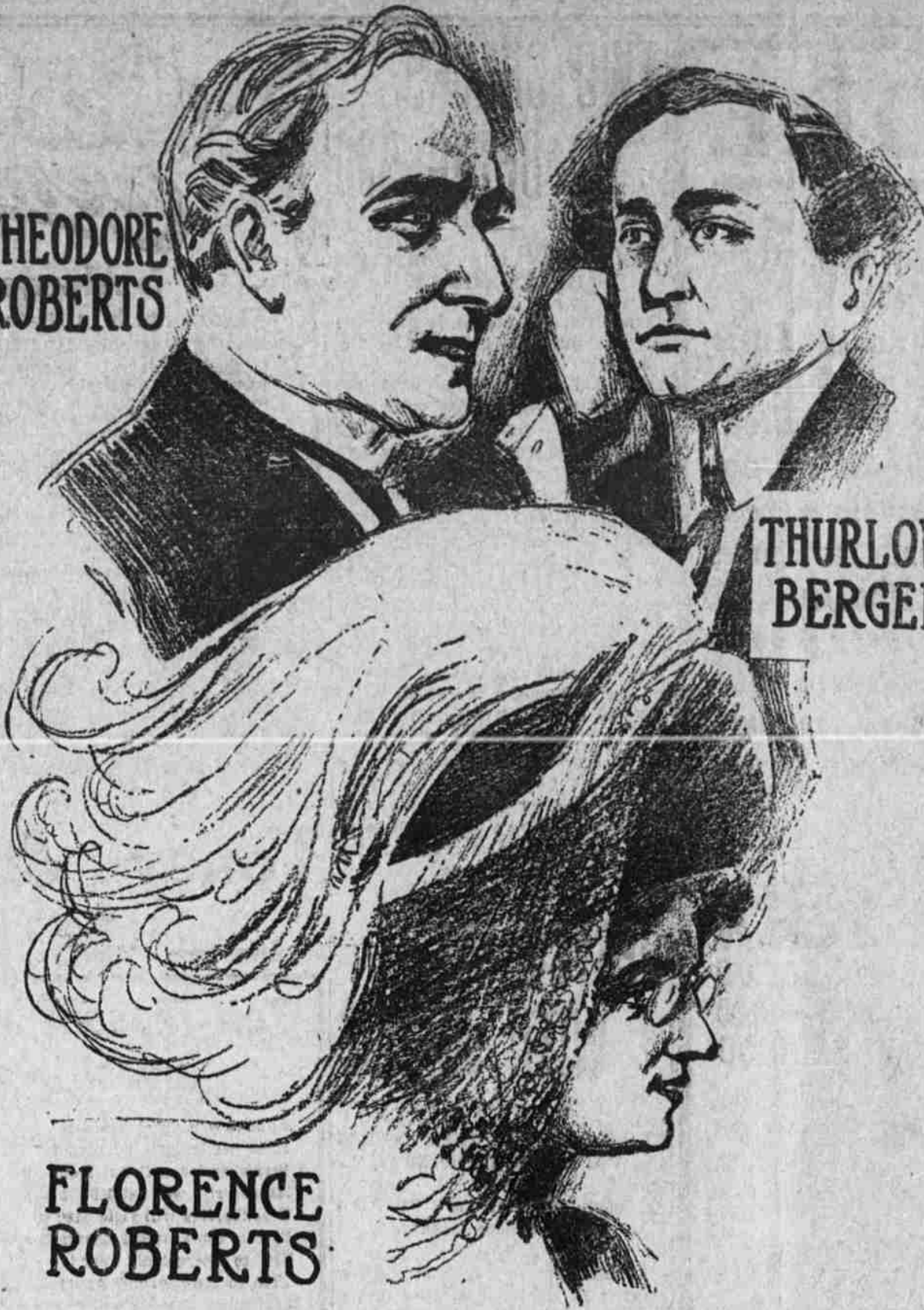

CONVICT LABEL LAW INVALID.

Judge Dismisses Abbott Case, as Interstate Commerce is Involved.

Portland, Or., Oct. 4.—The measure passed at the last session of the legislature, requiring that all convict made goods exposed for sale in Oregon be stamped conspicuously was held invalid recently by Circuit Judge Gatens, who ordered the discharge from custody of J. T. Abbott, an East Side merchant, arrested and indicted two months ago for selling a pair of shoes, made in the Kentucky prison and which did not bear the stamp. Abbott has been on bail since his arrest.

The case involved the question of restraint on interstate commerce, and it was on this point that the decision of the judge was based. Abbott's lawyers referred to decisions in other states in which similar laws had been declared unconstitutional because they operated to deprive the citizen of his property without due process of law and were unreasonable exercises of police power.

TRUANCY WAR OPENED AGAIN

NEW FEATURES OF LAW EXPLAINED TO PARENTS.

Officer Faulk on Trail of Violators of School Attendance Laws.

Truancy in city school districts is covered by more stringent laws this year and Truant Officer I. W. Faulk is on the trail of several violators of the law. Between the ages of nine and 16 years, all children must be in school and parents are held responsible as before for their attendance in school. Jail sentences go with the punishing which consists of \$5 to \$25 fine and jail sentence if such is ordered by the judge.

Several employers about the city and some farmers too it is said have employed boys under 16 to work during the school year, and wherever these can be found the youngsters are ordered to school.

Another feature of the law often violated is that parents cannot teach the children themselves without a permit from the county school superintendent. This law too has been violated in La Grande says Officer Faulk. The truancy list is not large but several have been rounded up and headed toward the school buildings.
