APPLE MARKET IS IMPROVED

CONDITIONS GENERALLY STRONG. ER. SAY REPORTS.

Northwest Fruit Exchange Issues Encouraging Bulletin.

(By Northwest Fruit Exchange.)
Portland, Oct. 6.—(Special)—The apple situation is generally stronger, and the demand more active. The call centers in the most popular varieties, however, such as Jonathans, Rome Beauties, Spitzenbergs, Winesaps and Staymens, with some calls for Ben Davis and other hard storage varieties. Practically every order calls for large sizes—four tier and larger—which are scarce throughout the northwest this season, and the demand is principally for the fancy and extra fancy grades. Medium and choice grades are in light request, as the country is full of apples of only medium to poor quality. Since its last report the exchange has made the following sales:

For account of Cashmere Fruit Growers' Union, Cashmere, Wash. 1 car extra fancy Spitzenbergs, \$2.00; fancy \$1.75 "C" \$1.50; 1 car extra fancy Staymen Winesaps \$1.50; 1 car Rome Beauties and 1 car Black Twigs, assorted grades, extra fancy \$1.50; fancy \$1.40 "C" grade 90c, both varieties. All sales fob Cashmere.

For account of Nampa, Idaho, Fruit Growers' association, 1 car White Winter Pearmain, extra fancy, \$1.25; standard \$1.25, "C" grade \$1.00, with discount on off sizes, fob Nampa.

For account of Fremont Wood, Boise Idaho: 1 car standard grade Jonathans at \$1.25, fob Boise.

For account Spokane Highlands Fruit Growers' association: 2 cars of Rome Beauties, assorted fancy and extra fancy grades, at \$1.25, straight, fob Washington.

Deciduous Fruits.

The eastern auctions continue low on Italian prunes; receipts of California and eastern grapes continue heavy, and keep the market down on all deciduous small fruits. In Chicago, yesterday, Italians averaged 75c; Hungarians 79c; Elberta peaches 73c. The exchange has sold several cars fob shipping point as follows:

GN 91316 from Meyers Falls, Wash., 29 mixed fruits; Flemish Beauty, Ida., Fall Butter, few Anjous, \$1.40; Elberta and Champion peaches 60c; Italian prunes 60c, all fob Washington.

PFE 8898, straight car prunes from Boise, 26th, at 65c fob Boise.

The exchange points out the greatly superior results which it has obtained under its method of fob marketing and wide distribution to the smaller markets, over the results which the auction centers have been making, at the same time, for fruit of the same character.

Bedlam.

How many people use the expression "a regular bedlam" without knowing bedlam's "where or what."
