

Throne Room In the Vatican, Where Pope Receives Visitors

EW travelers go to Rome without seeing the outside of the Vatican, the magnificent palace that for hundreds of years has been the residence

of the head of the Roman Catholic church. The Vatican stands ou ground that was once occupied as the gardens of the Emperor Nero. Pope Symmachus first built a residence there in the early years of the sixth century. Nicholas V (1447-55) began a systematic policy of improving the Vatican, which has been followed by his successors. The palace is now a series of buildings covering nearly fourteen acres and containing about 1,100 rooms. The throne room, pictured above, is where the pontiff holds format audiences, and this room has in past years been seen by notable persons from all parts of the world.
