# PENDLETON'S MILITIA DIES

ORGANIZATION HAS HARD LIFE CONTINUALLY.

Lack of Officials to Manipulate Company Spells Disbandment.

(Pendleton E. O.)

Co. L. 3rd Regiment, Oregon National Guards will become an extinct organization on the 26th of this month, for on that date the militiamen composing it will be mustered out of service. This unfortunate ending of the local company comes as the result of a long hard fight in the face of great hardships, and while it is regretted all around, it is felt that it is the only solution to a difficult problem.

The order for disbanding has not arrived yet, but a letter from the adjutant general in Portland brings the announcement of the contemplated action and the date upon which the company will be mustered out.

### Lieut. Vinier Resigns.

The resignation of First Lieut. Chas. Vinier, which was sent in October 2, perhaps hurried the crisis which has been pending for some time, for this officer has practically been in charge of the company since the resignation of Captain Charles Ferguson. The actual command has been placed in the hands of Captain of Ordinance M. S. Kern, but owing to his residence away from the city, the principal duties have developed upon Lieut. Vinier. For the past six months efforts have been made to secure a competent man to take the captaincy but no one could be found. Lieut. Vinier did not care to take the position himself, inasmuch as the absence from the city of Captain Kern and Second Lieutenant Elmer Storie left the whole burden upon him, he felt called upon to resign.

### Handicapped Financially.

Ever since its organization some five years ago, Co. L has had to exist in the face of handicaps. The annual appropriation of \$600 was insufficient for the many needs of the company and their activities was in consequence badly hampered. One after another the commanding officers were forced to resign on account of the pressure of their private business and it became a more and more difficult task to fill their places.

However the company never was in better condition than it is right now and this makes the necessity of disbanding particularly regrettable. To the last encampment Co. L went with 49 men, nearly 80 per cent of its enlisted membership, and there has been increased interest ever since.

# GUN PLAY IN STRIKE STRIFE

Jake Nibler, for many years a resident of this city, and a machinist, is out on \$100 bonds today pending a hearing of charges preferred against him by local strikers, namely, that of threatening to kill. The arrest is the upshot of a gun play late yesterday, when Nibler is said to have pulled out two revolvers and threatened to shoot at some strikers who claimed that they were attempting to persuade him to leave the shops of the O-W. here.

Nibler was arraigned on a somewhat serious charge and will likely be given trial tomorrow. A. L. Youmann is the complaining witness. The statement of the situation as given out by the strikers is:

What might have led to serious trouble, was happily averted yesterday afternoon by a striking machinist taking to his heels and making a quick get away from the vicinity of Jake Nibler, one of the railroad strikebreakers, when he was approached by a committee of the strikers who asked permission to talk with him. When the request was made Nibler not deeming one gun of sufficient magnitude to intimidate the strikers, pulled two and declared that he would shoot if they came a step nearer to him.

A. L. Youmann, one of the strikers, started toward Nibler and requested permission to talk with him, when Nibler suddenly pulled two guns and declared that the first man that came a step nearer to him he would shoot. Mr. Youmann, thinking, discretion the better part of valor, turned and ran away, not that he was scared of Nibler's war machinery but because he was fully aware that if trouble of this kind was once started, there would be telling where the end would be.

So far in La Grande there has been no trouble whatever, and that of yesterday afternoon was the first to arise and from all accounts was altogether uncalled for. There is not a striker in La Grande that is armed with anything larger than a pocket knife and most of these are broken. The strikers have instructions to use no violence of any kind, and if the strike is won it will be won in a peaceable manner.
