# IRA CANTRELL MEETS DEATH

SUSTAINS FATAL INJURIES NEAR EUGENE.

Leg Severed by Drag Saw and Dies From Shock Soon After.

Ira Cantrell, at one time a resident of La Grande, then of Baker and of late residing in Waterville, near Eugene, was killed from injuries received in a sawmill yesterday. One leg was cut off by a drag saw and before he could be taken to the hospital he had died of the shock. No definite announcement of the funeral arrangements are contained in telegrams received by William Cantrell, a brother living at Hilgard, and Mr. and Mrs. Adna B. Rogers, relatives of the deceased. Mr. Cantrell is survived by a wife and one child.

Mr. Cantrell was well known throughout the county; he was raised in La Grande and had many friends in this section.

# ASSISTANTS WORK HARD

EXAMINATIONS FOR FOREST RANGERS SOON.

No Easy nap Job for Applicants Must Be Real Woodsmen.

Washington, Oct. 12.—Various are the accomplishments required of the men who take examinations provided by the civil service commission for candidates who vain would be assistant forest rangers. Examinations will be held October 23 and 24 in the middle west and Pacific coast states, New Mexico, Arizona and Alaska.

The entrance salary of an assistant forester is \$1,100 a year. When practicable, rangers must be citizens of the state or territory in which the national forest on which they are appointed is situated. Outsiders therefore have small chance of getting jobs. There are many things a ranger must be and know. A ranger of any grade must be thoroughly sound and able-bodied, performing severe labor under trying conditions. He must be able to take care of himself and his horse in regions remote from settlement and supplies. He must be able to build trails and cabins, ride and lead pack horses and mules. He must know something of land surveying, estimating and sealing timber, logging, land laws, mining, and the live stock business.

Invalids seeking light out-of-door employment need not apply. For duty in some parts of Arizona and New Mexico the ranger must know enough Spanish to conduct forest business with Mexicans. Where saddle horses or pack horses are necessary in the performance of their duty, rangers are required to own and maintain them.

Rangers' duties include patrol to prevent fire and trespass, estimating, surveying, and marking timber, the supervision of cuttings, and similar work. They issue minor permits, build cabins and trails, oversee grazing business, investigate claims, report on applications and report upon and arrest for violation of forest laws and regulations.

The examination will consist of questions regarding the use of the forest, supplemented by a field test. Horses for the tests in riding and packing will be provided by the forest service.
