JURORS 'HANG' IN HEN TRIAL

HAMILTON'S FATE KEEPS JURY OUT LONG.

Debate and Votes Continue All Night—Second Ten Case Up.

Taking vote after vote, remaining in session all night, and unable to agree whether or not Hamilton, the aged man who was defendant in the case stole two chickens as charged, the jury in the state vs. Hamilton case reported its inability to agree this morning. It was expected that the jurors would be out about five minutes yet the time wore on and on until the rising sun this morning made it clear no agreement could be reached. It is reported that the jury stood seven to five for acquittal from first to last and never changed.

The Spencer Lawrence chicken case went to the jury early this morning. State versus Raymond, wherein watch stealing is accused, is the next case.
