ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL RECORD

TWO HUNDRED AND TWENTY-TWO REGISTERED NOW.

Attendance Yesterday Outdoes All Former Records of the School.

Record attendance in the La Grande high school for any one day was set yesterday when 222 students were present at classes. This is not only the record for recent years but statistics show it to be the largest in the history of high school in this city.

The record is not made up, either, of an overwhelmingly large freshman class but represents large classes covering the four years. The manual training and domestic science equipment combined with the county high school law now effective, are, in conjunction with the increase of high school aged pupils in the city, held responsible for the large attendance.

VALE HEARS NEWS.

Railroad Construction Out of That Town Is Ordered.

Vale, Oct. 17.—More definite railroad news reached Vale Saturday morning through the announcement that the appropriation which has been recently given for the building of the first portion of the Oregon Eastern out of this city towards the interior calls for the construction of 36 miles of railroad. The information also gives more light as to the extensiveness of the work in the local yards. Seven miles of track consisting of seven one mile side

tracks, are to be put down in the local yards to accommodate the vast amount of material necessary for rushing the work on the first 29 miles of the Oregon & Eastern out of this city.

Deals now on between the railroad company and a number of property owners along the right of way of the local yards back up all information received and shows that more trackage room is needed for the extensive piece of work undertaken here. The latter part of last week the Z. G. Wilson property, west of the irrigation ditch, was purchased by the railroad company, and a deal is now on for the Hy Doris property which lies just across the street and east of the block owned by the railroad on Morton and Cottage streets. If the deal is made the Doris seven-room cottage is to be used as headquarters for the construction engineers who will have charge of the work on the Oregon Eastern railroad.

Engineer North, of Chief Engineer Stradley's office who was in town last Saturday for an inspection trip of the work going on in the local yards, was well pleased with the progress that had been made.

According to Assistant Superintendent A. Q. Campbell of the Short Line, who was in the city Wednesday, the extension of the Oregon & Eastern is quite favorable for this winter. There has been no official announcement further than the work now undertaken in the local yards, but the fact that the maps of Oregon Eastern are now taking a prominent place in the offices at headquarters preparatory to being turned over to the construction department again shows that railroad construction work is to be rushed on west of this city as soon as the trackage is placed in the local yard.

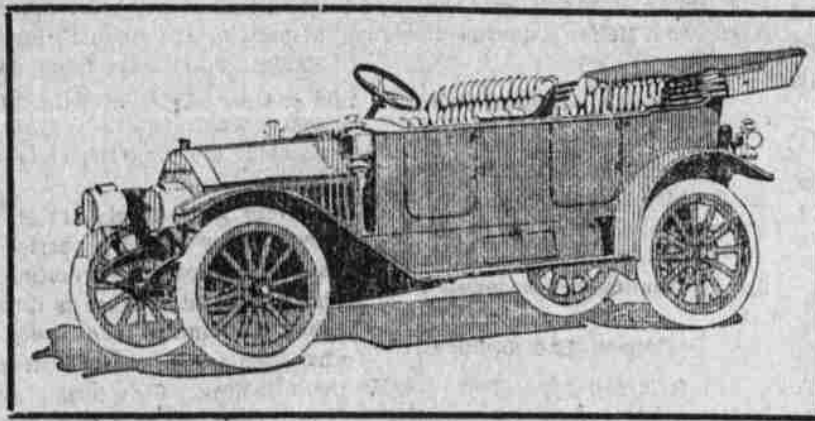
