**POLITICAL CLUB
 AT WHITMAN**

**STUDENTS TO STUDY SUBJECTS
 OF PRESENT HOUR MOVEMENT.**

Club Not Confined to Whitman Scholars Alone, but Anyone Eligible.

Whitman College, Walla Walla, Wn., Oct. 18.—(Special)—An innovation in western college life was inaugurated at Whitman by the organization of a Students' Politics club. It is the plan of the club to discuss and have presented some of the practical problems that are confronting the American public today and especially the problems as found in our larger cities. The membership of the club is not confined to students but any one interested in the work may be admitted. The club will hold at least one meeting per month. Some of the leading men of the city and of the northwest will be secured to give addresses during the year.

**NEW PRESIDENT OF MINNESOTA
 TAKES OFFICE.**

Gathering of Educateds Marks Ordination to Presidency.

Minneapolis, Minn., Oct. 18.—In the presence of one of the most notable gatherings of American educators ever assembled at one time Dr. George E. Vincent was installed as president of the University of Minnesota today, succeeding Dr. Cyrus Northrop, who retire some time ago after having served for 25 years as head of the university. The inauguration brought to this city representatives of more than 50 of the leading universities and colleges of the United States and Canada. The day's program was opened with an academic procession in which the educators, alumni, students, faculties and guests, all wearing academic gowns according to their degree, took part. The procession was followed by formal exercises in the armory. Dr. Vincent was introduced by his predecessor, Dr. Northrop. In a brief speech of welcome, former Governor John Lind, president of the board of regents, formally turned over to the new president the administration of the university. Greetings from other institutions and from the faculty, student body and alumni of the University of Minnesota followed. President William O. Thompson of the Ohio state university presented the congratulations of the National Association of State Universities. The formal exercises concluded with the inaugural address of the new president.

Dr. George E. Vincent, who becomes third president of the University of Minnesota, comes to the institution from the University of Chicago, where he served for ten years as professor of sociology. He was born in Rockford, Ill., 47 years ago and is the son of Bishop John H. Vincent of the Methodist Episcopal church. After he graduated from Yale in 1885 he engaged in editorial work for one year and then made an extensive tour of Europe and the Orient. Upon his return to America he became literary editor of the Chautauqua Press. He went to the University of Chicago in 1892 as a fellow in sociology and continued as an instructor and professor at that institution until his election last year as president of the University of Minnesota.
