SCHOOL GROWS WITH RAPIDITY

LA GRANDE BUSINESS COLLEGE TAKES NEW QUARTERS.

Commercial Law Course to Hear Lectures by Local Attorneys.

Outgrowing its original facilities, and leasing larger quarters, the La Grande business college leased several large rooms in the Lewis building on Depot street, in La Grande. The management was forced to secure larger rooms, as the school is growing so rapidly, that the present quarters in the Foley building are too small for the rapidly increasing number of students. The college moves to its new quarters November 15.

The night class in commercial law will be taught by R. J. Green, a La Grande attorney, who owns an interest in the college. From time to time other attorneys will address this class. The class in commercial law is especially designed for the benefit of business men, and those about to enter business life.

The college now has four teachers on its staff, three of whom are graduates of leading universities.

Professor Taylor, the principal, is one of the ablest business college instructors in Oregon, and was the founder, and former owner of the Wenatchee business college, one of the largest and most successful colleges in Washington.

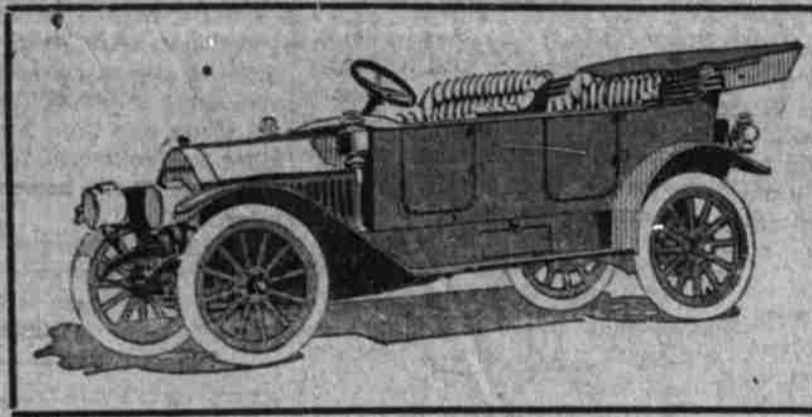

Powell, editor of the Oregon Emerald, and president and leader of the Glee club, by playing in the town orchestra, and doing other work in the summer, has thus far kept the wolf from the door, although he is entirely dependent upon his own resources for his support.

Jones, president of the student Y. M. C. A., and editor of the Engineering Magazine, not being gifted with musical ability, has earned his way by the more humble vocations of clerking, store sweeping and milking a family cow. Despite his somewhat burdensome outside work, Jones finds time to take part in student activities.
