BISHOP SEES 60 CONFIRMED

CATHOLICISM HAS INNING YESTERDAY IN CITY.

Presence of Bishop and Big Class Attracted Large Audiences.

Right Reverend Charles O'Reilly, bishop of the Eastern Oregon diocese of the Catholic church officiated at the confirmation of a class of 60 confirmants yesterday afternoon, assisted by Father Aalders of the local church. The Catholic church was crowded to the doors yesterday afternoon with friends and relatives of the participants in the impressive ceremonies.

The confirmation services, commencing at 3 o'clock, and the most important of the day, were not, however, the only church functions during the day. Early mass and again at late mass, the church was filled to capacity.

Bishop O'Reilly delivered stirring addresses to the class and audience. The size of the class and the presence of the bishop made the day one of extreme moment to the membership of the church.
