BLUE STEM IS IN LIMELIGHT

NORTHWEST PRODUCES SPLENDID GRADE OF WHEAT.

Buyers Find Oregon Wheat Better Than Australian "Purple Strain"

The east is after Pacific northwest wheat, says a Portland paper yesterday. During the past few days 50 carloads have been sold for that destination by local parties.

The wheat was of the bluestem variety and is a favorite with millers everywhere. Nowhere, not even in its home in Australia, where it is called "purple straw," does it attain such perfection as in some portions of Oregon.

For some time Minneapolis millers, who operate on the greatest scale in the world, have been trying to purchase wheat from this section. Owing to the short crop of the better quality at home, they have been forced to look elsewhere for supplies and the blue stem of the Pacific northwest fills their needs in this respect.

Up to this time the bids of the eastern millers have been from 2 to 3 cts. a bushel below the prices asked on the Pacific coast; therefore, no business resulted until the last 24 hours.

It is stated that samples of northwest bluestem have recently reached the east and the quality was so much better than expected that deals were closed at once for 50 carloads. In order to study the situation better several of the eastern mills have dispatched representatives to Oregon and additional purchases may be expected.

Bluestem wheat was generally quoted at 84 cents a bushel for track delivery tide water by local buyers today.

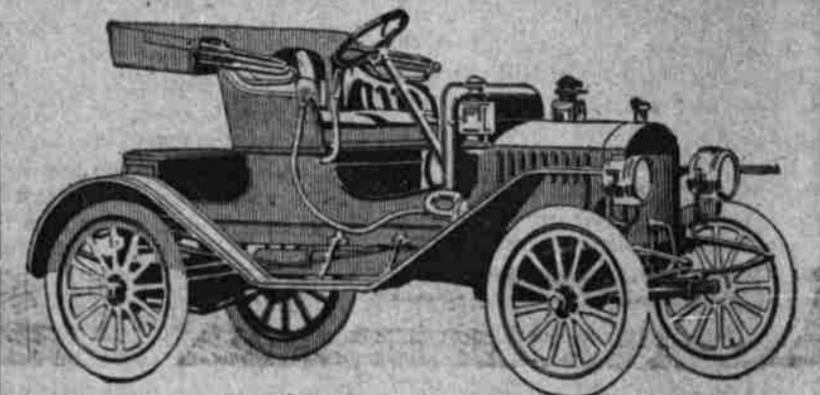
