Section 1. The mayor and recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the said Fabric Fire Hose Co., A. G. Long, general agent, for the purchase and delivery to the city of La Grande, Oregon, of 1500 feet of fire hose; said hose to be Keystone brand, waxed hose, and of the character mentioned in the bid of the said Fabric Hose Co., A. G. Long, general agent, the price therefor to be the same as the bid of the said Fabric Fire Hose Co., A. G. Long, general agent, and the hose to be delivered as required by the city of La Grande, Oregon.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the council, approval by the mayor and publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, this 25th day of October, 1911, by five councilmen voting therefor.
