Apple Market Unchanged Reports the Portland Handling Company.

### BETTER APPLES SHOWN

Practically every merchant agrees this fall that farmers and orchardists about La Grande are bringing in a better quality of apples for the local market than ever before. The stringent inspection laws strictly enforced during the past few years has gradually made it clear that no poor and diseased fruit will be allowed on the market, and furthermore the people who raise the apples are becoming anxious of having only good varieties shown on the local market.

(By Northwestern Fruit Exchange.) Portland, Ore., Nov. 6.—(Special)—The market situation continues practically unchanged, with no indication of falling off in the demand for strictly fancy fruit in standard varieties, and large sizes, and with no improvement in the poor demand for ordinary stock and small sizes. The exchange is refusing dozens of orders every day on account of not having the fruit to offer. One of the best known fruit men in the northwest recently wrote the exchange:

"You have done a lot of good for the northwestern fruit growers this year. I thought your judgment was too high on prices at the opening of the season, but it has turned out that you were nearer correct than I."

The distribution effected by the exchange, and the prices obtained for the growers, has been so much better and the returns of the cash proceeds so much quicker, that it is unfortunate that more associations did not co-operate with the exchange. In this connection the exchange reproduces a newspaper report of an extract from the address of Prof. C. W. A. Veditz of the George Washington university. (Washington, D. C., government expert on the new tariff board, before a meeting of the American Institute of Bankers:

"The so-called 'little business men' he said, are rapidly becoming a living monument to the shameful waste and wanton stupidity of uncontrolled competition."

Does not this bit of shrewd observation by a prominent government expert point a moral to the fruit growers?

## CONFESSOR IS OBSTINATE

WILL NOT WAIVE EXAMINATION; IN JAIL.

Admits He Confessed but Will Not Plead Guilty to Charge.

Although he has confessed he stole the James Garrity buggy and W. J. Church horse and made off with them to Baker, where he made his first confession, George Ward will stand trial on a charge of thievery. He gave himself up in Baker where the stolen property was recovered and when he was brought to La Grande he again admitted his act but when placed before the committing magistrate, refused to waive examination and witnesses had to be called to prove that he had confessed.

He was bound over to the grand jury and unless he pleads guilty will be put to trial. The state in that event must prove the theft and also prove that Ward confessed to stealing the horse. He admitted on the witness stand that he had taken the horse but would not waive examination.
