CITY PHONE LINE A FAILURE.

Municipality Finds Heavy Increase in Rates Necessary.

According to an Associated Press dispatch the telephone system owned by the Manitoba government shows a deficit of \$150,000 this year, according to Frank Patterson, chairman of the telephone commission. The system showed a surplus the previous two years. Chairman Patterson suggests as a remedy the doubling of rates on business telephones, the establishment of four-party lines and an increase in the rate for rural telephones.

PIONEER OIL FINDER IS 87

PENNSYLVANIAN WHO HELPED TO FIND OIL, CELEBRATES.

One of Original Discoverers of Pennsylvania Oil, Lives Here.

Seth Baker, 906 D street, South La Grande, celebrated his 87th birthday Saturday, November 4th.

Mr. Baker is one of the pioneer oil men of Pennsylvania, remembering distinctly when oil was first discovered in that state. About nine years ago Mr. Baker and his family, consisting of two sons, J. A. and G. H., and a niece, Miss Young, traveled from Pueblo, Colo., to Promise, Oregon, in wagons. They were about three months on the way. Mr. Baker located on a claim in the Eden country, across the river from Promise. As soon as he "proved up" on his homestead he came to La Grande, and has since resided here.

Mr. Baker still enjoys good health for a man of his advanced years.

GOVERNORS' TOUR CHANGED

RIVERS AND HARBORS' CONGRESS TO BE VISITED.

Trip of Western Governors to the East.

Boise, Ida., Nov. 6. — (Special)—The schedule arranged for the tour of the east by the western "Governor's Special," has recently been changed in some particulars in order to admit of the attendance by the special's party at the important sessions of the National Rivers and Harbors congress which convenes at Washington in December, and the congress of governors of the southeastern states which takes place at Baltimore.

The changes were made in order to allow the western executives to embrace the opportunity of exchanging views with the governors from the southeast, which section, it is said, confronts many conditions similar to those of the west.

Owing to the fact that the western governors will have unequalled facilities for observing conditions in the east while on the tour, the trip of the special, it is thought, will enable the westerners to compare their own methods with those of others, so as to determine the best way in which to meet conditions in their own commonwealths.

That extensive preparations for the entertainment of the visiting governors are being made in each city on the special's itinerary, becomes evident from the numerous communications received at the office of Reilly Atkinson of this city, who is to manage the tour. It is said that not a few of the communications are invitations from woman suffrage clubs, who are desirous of having the chief executives of the states in which equal suffrage exists, make addresses favorable to their cause. Governors Shafroth of Colorado, Hawley of Idaho, Johnson of California and Hay of Washington are said to be in demand with the suffragette clubs.

Some notion of the amount of money annually turned into the business channels of this county through the stock business is obtainable through little calculation with the figures quoted above and a total of stock shipped will be compiled later in the season and moneys thus received will reach a figure astonishing to those who are in close touch with the extent and scope of the stock business here.

TAXPAYERS HAVE APPEALED CASE

HIGHEST TRIBUNAL TO HEAR ISSUES INVOLVED.

Reimbursement of Childers and Frawley Delayed Materially.

Bonds incidental to an appeal, and notice of such an appeal, were filed today by counsel for the Taxpayers' league, when Attorney John S. Hodgkin went through the requisite details that mean the reimbursement of County Treasurer John Frawley and Sheriff Frank Childers will be fought out before the highest tribunal in the state.

"We are fighting this issue to the last ditch," affirmed the taxpayers' attorney today when he had perfected the necessary arrangements.

The appeal is taken from the decision of Circuit Judge Knowles holding constitutional the act of the legislature ordering Frawley and Childers reimbursed for losses sustained in the failure of a local bank some time ago at which time county funds were lost.
