TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the City of La Grande, Oregon, on the 4th day of October, 1911, creating improvement district No. 41 and designating V avenue as such district, and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 4th day of October, 1911 whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of V avenue, in said improvement district as hereinafter described, by laying thereon standard board walk, south side, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be improved are as follows:

All that portion of V avenue from the east line of Spruce street, to the east city limits.
