George Davis was arraigned today as being a third man in the wheat stealing case wherein Walter Glenn lost some wheat through theft. Two others implicated have already been arraigned.

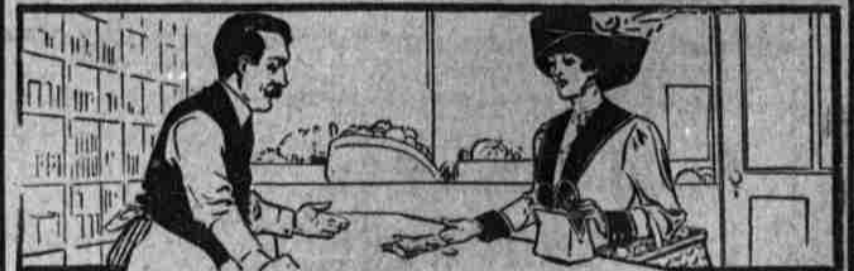
## G. S. Dunphy Dead.
