ROAD READY FOR SNOW

BRANCH LINE ENGINES PROVIDED WITH PLOWS.

Rotary Being Painted Up and Put in Shape for Instant Service.

Preparation for snow and ice on the branch and mountain divisions is being made by the O.-W. here this week. Today the patented snow cleaner on the outgoing branch line engine was attached and tonight the engine which came in from Joseph today will be equipped with the arrangement which is operated from the cab by air, and is lowered to the rail at a moment's notice to clean snow and ice or mud from the tracks. When the tracks are cleared the apparatus is raised to a safe height. These arrangements were used to good effect last winter. One of the main line engines was also equipped this way last night and it will work on the Kamela hill where snow is to be anticipated in a few days.

Snow Plow Under Repairs.
A crew of painters is working on the rotary snow plow in the round house this week. The machine has been put into running order and much of it is already painted. The running gear and fans have yet to be painted and the whole machine will be just like new. Anticipation of early snow storms is responsible for the early attention to this much-needed machine in winter time.

BUTTER FAT CLIMBS.

Thirty-Six Cents Paid by Local Creameries Commencing Today.

Higher cost of living and increased remuneration to dairymen is realized in a quotation to La Grande creameries today. Butter fat is selling at 36 cents a pound, a near-record price and butter at the retail shops has gone up accordingly. One-pound rolls are quoted at 45 cents and two-pound rolls at 85 cents. The urgency of more dairy herds in this valley is pictured in the high winter prices and dealers say that the present supply is not nearly enough to go around. Few localities in the state afford better dairy facilities and require a bigger supply than the Grande Ronde valley.
