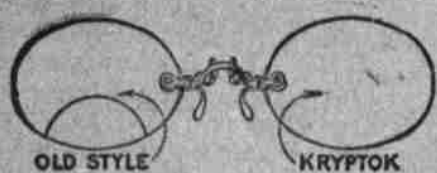

# HUGE TREES UPROOTED
