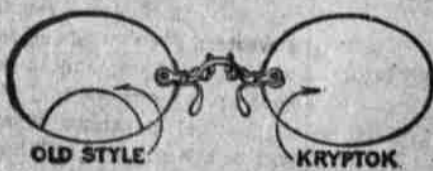

Portland Market Conditions Summarized for Busy Readers.

"Local eggs very scarce; chicken market steady; turkeys rather dull; dressed lambs erratic; hops sell higher; first car navel orange and Hood River apples go to Hongkong."

So reads a hurried synopsis of the market condition in Portland yesterday. Portland potato handlers say that the Harriman lines are not supplying ample cars and that it is difficult to get carload shipments away.
