LIBRARY GIVEN MORE IMPETUS

COMMISSION WITH E. E. BRAGG AT HEAD NAMED.
Note Determined Steps Taken Looking Toward Fine Library.

La Grande's library commission, put into existence to point the way to a public library, was appointed and the appointment ratified at the council meeting last night. The nine members will perfect an organization shortly and proceed to carry out the object of their appointment. This commission was appointed at the behest of a large petition of taxpayers, the movement being long since a popular one, but never before coming to a precise head. The statutes of the state prescribe that such a commission shall be named by the mayor and once appointed will have power to go forward with the preliminary work of getting the li-

brary started. In this particular instance, a public subscription will be taken to get the very nucleus of a library; get some books into circulation and have a working basis. Once this done, Andrew Carnegie is to be asked to contribute, as he does in all similar instances, when the city already has something of a library. A permanent building is the probable donation from Carnegie. In the meantime the library will have grown and become important. Once all these requirements are fulfilled, the annual upkeep of the library will run upon the city at large, and will amount to a small fraction of one mill yearly—a sum of money that is extremely trifling but is required of the councils in all cities where Carnegie contributes any material sum for library purposes.

Mayor Richardson made his appointment of the commission before going to Portland and the names were read and ratified last evening.

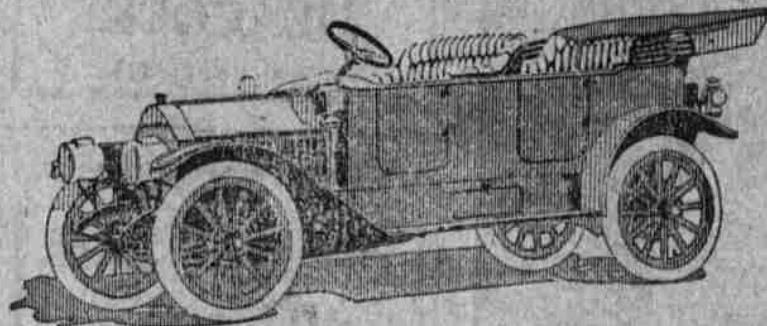
