by a lad of 17 unless she was perfectly willing and it is my opinion that she desired to use him as a tool. With flattering promises of "Easy money," she got the boy to join her on a junket to Oregon and thereby made my son a white slaver although she paid the carfare." This is the way the father explains it. The girl claims she was misled into going with the boy across the state line.

The boy's arrest on the white slavery charge followed his incarceration a few days ago for stealing a suit case on the main line train. He got off at La Grande with the suit case, but the owner discovered the loss before reaching Hilliard and hurried back to La Grande on the next train

finding the suit case at a local hotel. In this fact lies the foundation for the arrest on white slavery. When the boy was caught in the act, he telephoned to a girl in Baker to come to his aid. She came and with her coming a systematic investigation was begun by the police. The upshot of it was that she confessed to having occupied a house of ill fame at Baker and gave her ill gotten earnings in the sum of \$20 over to the boy who was chased out of Baker. He came here with her money in his pocket, she says. The sweating given the girl here resulted in the facts being turned over to the Portland police.

Letters found by the police indicate that other girls in Boise had been similarly connected and one writes a scathing letter of denunciation to the boy because he had taken up with the girl in question now. The affair is badly muddled and it will require extensive probing, no doubt, to put the
