NEAR-RECORD PRICE REACHED Here.
Creameries Issue New Quotations to Dairymen.

Butterfat is bringing the ranchman who is in position to sell cream and milk a lucrative remuneration. Thirty-eight cents is what the creameries in La Grande are paying this week and the quotation is near the high water mark, too. A few weeks ago it sold for 33 cents, and the scarcity of cream throughout the state is responsible, along with the increasing demands brought on by the approaching holidays.

Butter will attain the highest record this winter it ever has in this city, according to local creamerymen's guesses. It would not be surprising to see the figure go still higher, 40 cents perhaps, to be quoted. In such an event butter would go correspondingly high.
