LOCAL LAWYERS TO LEAD FIGHT

ATTACK ON NEW LAW IS POPULAR ONE.

Portland Attorneys Agree With Crawford and Cochran.

Portland attorneys, republican and democratic alike, are agreed with La Grande lawyers that the new presidential convention delegates and electors' law is unconstitutional.

Those who read the interview with Attorney T. H. Crawford in the Observer a few days ago, will understand the appended clipping without further introduction of the theme.

(Portland Oregonian.)

Unless prevented by press of private business, Judge Thomas H. Crawford, democrat, and Charles E. Cochran, republican, both of Union county, will bring suit in the state circuit court at Salem to test the constitutionality of the law adopted by the people last November and providing for the popular election by the republican and democratic voters of this state of delegates to their national political conventions, and at the same time nominate candidates for presidential electors.

This statute provides that the members of the two political parties in the primary election next April shall elect ten delegates to their national convention and nominate five candidates for presidential elector to be elected in the following general election in November. The law provides that the individual elector shall vote for one candidate for delegate and no more, although there are ten offices to be filled. In nominating candidates for presidential elector, the individual elector is restricted to voting for only one candidate and no more.

Demand to Precede Suit.

"We will first make a demand of the secretary of state that he print on the official primary nominating ballots instructions for each voter to vote for ten delegates and five candidates for presidential elector," said Judge Crawford at the Imperial. "If the secretary declines to comply with our request we shall bring suit to test the constitutionality of the law, and at the same time require him, through mandamus proceedings, to print the desired instructions to voters. These actions will be taken in plenty of time to obtain a final decision in advance of the primary nominating election April 19. I have not investigated the subject yet, but I am inclined to the opinion that the proceeding may be instituted in the supreme court direct. This would insure a speedy determination of the questions involved."

"This law in this particular unquestionably is unconstitutional from the mere fact that no court would hold legal any statutory enactment which seeks to deprive the elector of the right of suffrage. This statute violates at least two provisions of the state constitution, which provide that all elections shall be free and equal and that every qualified elector, who is duly registered, is entitled to vote for every office. Under our present laws a delegate to either the republican or democratic national convention or the candidate for presidential elector is just as much an office as is justice of the supreme court.

Restriction Deemed Unfair.

"With the individual voter restricted to voting for only one of the five or 10 offices to be filled, as provided in absolutely impossible to distribute the this objectionable statute, it will be delegations from either party over the state as it should be. The result will be that probably every delegate and all of the presidential electors will be elected from Multnomah county, the center of population and where every candidate for either of the offices will receive more votes than any candidate in the smaller counties.

"The unfairness of these provisions are of vital interest to the members of the republican and democratic parties. I shall ask the hearty co-operation of the members of both parties

in the suit to have this statute corrected so that the voter will have the privilege of voting for a full delegation to his party's national convention and also assist in nominating the full quota of five candidates for presidential elector who will be elected in the November, 1912, election.

Joint Fight Decided.

"I do not desire my position to be misunderstood, for I am heartily in favor of the election of these officers by direct vote of the people. What I do want and what I shall undertake to obtain as such a change in the law as will enable every voter to vote for as many candidates as there are offices to be filled."

"Judge Crawford and I have agreed to bring the proposed action jointly," said Mr. Cochran. "He is a democrat and I am a republican, so there would be no politics involved. I thoroughly agreed with Judge Crawford in his contention that the voters of the state under the operation of the present statute are disfranchised in the election of these officers."

H. B. Van Duser, president of the Jackson club, predicts that the law which Judge Crawford has so severely criticised would, in its operation, pave the way for disorganized delegations from both parties in the national conventions.

Many prominent democrats and republicans in Portland are quoted in the interview and with one exception all agree with the La Grande attorney.

WRIGGLING SIGNS.

How the Movable Effect is Obtained in Electrical Designs.

A great many electric signs are of the moving type. Walk down most any city street after dark and you will see many illuminated signs of novel and interesting design. Here a long red and blue snake seems to be wriggling from the street to the top of a building. On the other side a wheel is rapidly revolving, below it yellow smoke is issuing in clouds from a huge brown cigar. There is also a large theater sign which suddenly flashes into view, only to disappear after an interval long enough to read it.

It is quite puzzling to the ordinary pedestrian to explain the wonderful light effects. It is apparent that the light is obtained from electricity, but this is about all that is understood. In such signs as where a snake seems to be wriggling along, a cat chases a rat, words that spell themselves letter by letter and in all other similar signs the effect is produced by a mechanical device called a "flasher," which lights the tiny electric sign lamps in the order required to produce the effect. This flasher is driven by a tiny motor.

The flasher is made up of a number of fingers, and each finger drops in its turn upon a metal plate that is electrically connected with a certain letter or series of letters, or, in the case of the snake or rat chasers, with certain bulbs. The flasher is driven rapidly, and in this way the snake can be speeded around its course very swiftly. Where the only effect desired is a sign in which one letter is illuminated at a time the flasher becomes a much simpler device, but in all cases the underlying principle is the same.—New York Tribune.

Helping the Coffee.

Some of the coffee sold roasted and ground causes complaint. Most of it can be improved a little. Trouble seems to be that it is not roasted enough and needs another touch of fire. You know the less it is roasted the more it weighs. Put a couple of tablespoonfuls in a seamless agate quart stewpan or cup and set it on the stove, gas or blue flame and shake it while it gets another scant parching, never letting it get hot enough to smoke or scorch. Set it aside till it gets cold and then pour on the water and finish up in the regular way.—New York Press.

Didn't Hit Him.
