

FISH LADDERS ON CATHERINE

MENACE TO FISH PROPOGATION IS TO BE REMOVED.

Deputy Game Warden Building One Ladder and Others Contemplated.

Chas. B. Oral, the game warden for this district, is at the Hall farm on Catherine creek, superintending the construction of a fish ladder in the dam owned by W. J. Townley. This is the seventh ladder which was constructed by Oral's work in this district and anglers hope that he will finish up the good work before he quits the job. It is reported that he was in consultation with the district attorney about the old Foye dam on Catherine creek at what is known as the Robbins mill. It is hoped that this old sore will be torn out of the stream as it has been a menace to the propagation of fish and of the migration of fish for 30 years.
