### 3RD PICTURE HOUSE SOON

#### BIRD F. LEWIS TO OPEN MOVING PICTURE HOUSE.

Addition to Be Built to Star Theatre During Coming Year.

A third moving picture theatre is to open January 1st when Bird F. Lewis will reopen the building formerly occupied by the Star theatre, known as the Lewis building. In the near future the building will have a brick addition of 40 feet placed on the rear so that Mr. Lewis can claim as large a theatre as any in the county. The theatre will be opened, however, under present conditions as to quarters and the addition is to follow later on. Arrangements for good substantial pictures are being made by Mr. Lewis at this time and he asserts he will have the show house in working condition by the first of the year.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 568, SERIES 1911.

An ordinance fixing and establishing the grades of X avenue, Oak street, Cedar street, Spring avenue, Walnut street, Twelfth street, Thirteenth street, Fourteenth street, Fifteenth street, Sixteenth street, H street, I street, J street and Washington avenue in the city of La Grande, Oregon.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. The grade of X avenue in the city of La Grande, Oregon, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at the center of the intersection of First and X avenue at a point 5.80 feet above city base, then east on a grade of 0.075 per cent to the center of Second street at a point 5.56 feet above city base; then east along center of street to intersection of Fourth street at a grade of 0.075 per cent to a point 5 feet above city base; then east from Fourth street on a grade of 0.72 per cent to North Depot at a point 4 feet below city base; then east from North Depot to center of North Fir street on a grade of 0.515 per cent to a point 6.50 feet below city base; then east on a grade of 1.064 per cent to center of Greenwood street, 7.00 feet below city base; then east on a grade of .641 per cent to North Spruce street to a point 9.50 feet below city base; then east on a grade of 0.423 per cent 1300 feet to city limits at a point 15.00 feet below city base.

Sec. 2. The grade of Oak street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at a point 75 feet above city base; thence along center of street 660 feet on center grade of

minus 1.818 per cent to center of intersection of Pennsylvania avenue at a point 55 feet above city base; thence along center of street 380 feet on center grade of minus 1.842 per cent to center of intersection of Spring avenue at a point 56 feet above city base; thence along center of street 345 feet on center grade of minus 3.943 per cent to center of intersection of Main avenue at a point 45.50 feet above city base; thence along center of street 115 feet on center grade of minus 8.795 per cent to north line of Washington avenue at a point 9 feet above city base; thence along center of street 389 feet on center grade of minus 0.657 per cent to center of intersection of Adams avenue at a point 6.50 feet above city base.

Sec. 3. The grade of Cedar street in the city of La Grande is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at a point 55.60 feet above city base; thence along center of street 320 feet on center grade of minus 0.781 per cent to center of intersection of Spring street at a point 53.10 feet above city base; thence along center of street 700 feet on center grade of minus 3.442 per cent to center of intersection of Spring street at a point 39 feet above city base; thence along center of street 180 feet on center grade of minus 1.888 per cent, thence 160 feet on a grade of 11 per cent to center of intersection of Main avenue at a point 18 feet above city base; thence along center of street 370 feet on center grade of minus 2.756 per cent to center of intersection of Washington avenue at a point 7 feet above city base; thence along center of street 425 feet on center grade of minus 0.8705 per cent to center of intersection of Adams avenue at a point 5.80 feet above city base.

Sec. 4. The grade of Spring avenue in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at a point 2782.00 feet elevation, which is city base, thence along center of street 740 feet on center grade of plus 1.5513 per cent to center of intersection of Second street at a point 10 feet above city base; thence along center of street 165 feet west at a point 12 feet above city base; thence along center of street 160 feet on center grade of plus 7.50 per cent to center of intersection of First street at a point 29 feet above city base; thence along center of street 140 feet on center grade of plus 6.00 per cent to center of intersection of Cedar street at a point 39 feet above city base; thence along center of street 300 feet on center grade of plus 8.666 per cent to center of intersection of Oak street at a point 56 feet above city base; thence along center of street 600 feet on center grade of plus 5.333 per cent to center of intersection of Alder street at a point 88

feet above city base. Sec. 5. The grade of Walnut street in the city of La Grande is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at a point 7 feet above city base; thence along center of street 200 feet on center grade of plus 1.50 per cent to a point 200 feet south which is 10 feet above city base; thence along center of street 225 feet on center grade of plus 13.111 per cent to center of intersection of Washington avenue at a point 39.50 feet above city base; thence along center of street 375 feet on center grade of plus 4.40 per cent to center of intersection of Main avenue at a point 56 feet above city base; thence along center of street 340 feet on center grade of plus 4.705 per cent to center of intersection of Spring avenue at a point 72 feet above city base; thence along center of street 1020 feet on center grade of plus 1.666 per cent to center of intersection of N avenue at a point 89 feet above city base.

Sec. 6. The grade of Twelfth street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at the center of intersection of Twelfth and Washington avenue at a point 22.50 feet below city base; thence south on center line of Twelfth street on a grade of 0.3 per cent to center of H street at a point 18.60 feet below city base.

Sec. 7. The grade of Thirteenth street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of Thirteenth street and Washington avenue at a point 24 feet below city base; thence south on center line of Thirteenth street to center of H street on a grade of 0.252 per cent to a point 21.25 feet below city base.

Sec. 8. The grade of Fourteenth street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at the center of intersection of Fourteenth street and Washington avenue at a point 25 feet below city base; thence on Fourteenth street on a grade of 0.4807 per cent to the center of H street at a point 23.50 feet below city base.

Sec. 9. The grade of Fifteenth street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at a point at the center of intersection of Fifteenth street and Washington avenue at a point 26.50 feet below city base; thence south on center line of Fifteenth street on a grade of 0.09 per cent to the center of H street at a point 26 feet below city base.

Sec. 10. The grade of Sixteenth street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at a point 27.80 feet below city base at the center of intersection of Sixteenth street and Washington avenue; thence south on a grade 0.021 per cent to the center of H street at a point 28.50 feet below

city base. Sec. 11. The grade of H street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at a point 18.60 feet below city base at the intersection of Twelfth and H street; thence east on center line of H street on a grade of 0.75 per cent to the center of Sixteenth street at a point 23.20 feet below city base.

Sec. 12. The grade of I street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at the center of I and Twelfth street at a point 19.40 feet below city base; thence east on a grade of 0.5937 per cent to center of Fifteenth street at a point 26.60 feet below city base.

Sec. 13. The grade of J street in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at the center of intersection of Twelfth street and J street at a point 20.50 feet below city base; thence on a grade of 0.672 per cent to the center of Fourteenth street at a point 24.50 feet below city base.

Sec. 14. The grade of Washington avenue in the city of La Grande, is fixed and established as follows:

Commencing at the center of intersection of Twelfth street and Washington avenue at a point 22.50 feet below city base; thence on a grade of 0.323 per cent to the city limits a distance of 1740 feet to a point 28.14 feet below city base.

This ordinance will be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor and publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.

Passed the common council on the 22nd day of November, by seven councilmen voting therefor.

Approved by the mayor on this, the 23rd day of November, 1911.
