Councilman, second ward—P. A. Foley, Independent; W. R. Jones, Independent; John Melville, socialist.

Councilman, third ward—R. L. Lincoln, Independent; Ernest Reiland, socialist.

Councilman, fourth ward—R. A. Masterton, Independent; J. R. Fitzgerald, socialist.
