TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given that in pursuance of a resolution adopted by the common council of the city of La Grande, Oregon, on the 21st day of December, 1910, creating improvement district No. 29, and designating X avenue as such district and in pursuance of a resolution adopted by said common council on the 8th day of November, 1911, whereby said council determined and declared its intention to improve all that portion of X avenue in said improvement district as herein-after described, by laying thereon a board sidewalk on north side, the council will, ten days after the service of this notice upon the owners of the property affected and benefited by such improvement, order that said above described improvement be made; that the boundaries of said district to be so improved are as follows: All that portion of X avenue from the east line of Spruce street to the east line of city limits.

(A) And the property affected or benefited by said improvement is as follows: Lots 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25 and 26, block 1, Pleasant Home addition to La Grande, Oregon.
