The pure food expert at a pure food show in New York took up a nutmeg. "Watch me jab this pin into the nutmeg here and there," he said. "Do you see how from each pin prick a little oil exudes? Well, that is a proof that the nurmeg is good. When a pin prick draws no oil from it it is a wooden nutmeg, nothing more.

"The nutnieg tree of Asia is seventy feet high The fruit is like a pear. The flesh of the fruit is like candled citron, and its seeds, our nutmeg proper, are enveloped in a yellow rind that is our mace

"Nutmeps are dried for two months in a moderate heat. They are then sorted, and the small and broken ones are thrown into the press for the purpose of extracting their oil, the essential oil of nutmeg being a very costly article of commerce.


