O. A. C. Professor Urges Installation of Small Plants.

Corvallis, Ore., Dec. 4,-(Special)-We should be shipping out trainloads of high grade vinegar, jellies. jams, canned apples and evaporated cumstances." ruits," said Prof. C. I. He advised co-operative vinegar and evaporating plants for growers to handle the culls.
