J. W. M'ALISTER IS RE-ELECTED

FARMERS' UNION OF STATE IN SESSION.

La Grande Man Is Replaced at Head of State Union.

After having re-elected J. W. McAllister of La Grande as state president and having re-elected the entire old board with but one exception, the farmers' union state convention came to an end last evening and the scores of farmers who were here in attendance upon the gathering are now wending their way homewards, says the Pendleton East Oregonian of yesterday. The final adjournment came at 11 o'clock last night and marked the close of a very interesting and enthusiastic gathering.

At the election of officers held yesterday the vice presidency went to Mr. Cruse of The Dalles while F. A. Sykes of this county was re-elected as secretary. C. C. Connor of Helix who was a member of the board during the past year, declined a re-election, because of the press of his private work, and his place on the board went to Mr. Daugherty, a delegate from Baker county.

Among those who were in attendance at the state meeting Pendleton is decidedly the favored town for the tri-state meeting to be held this winter. The invitation from the Commercial club to meet here this year was warmly received and efforts will be made by those who were in attendance to bring about such a result.

"We have met in Walla Walla for two years," said W. W. Harrah this morning, "and we would like to bring the convention to Pendleton for a change. Pendleton is a very convenient point in every way and we are in hopes of bringing the convention here. However, Walla Walla is endeavoring to secure the gathering again and has the prestige of having entertained the past conventions in good style. The place for the tri-state meeting will be selected by the joint officers of the associations from this state, Washington and Idaho."
