**RATE MATTERS WORRY COUNCIL**

SECRETARY FOR RATING BOARD FILES COMPLAINT.

Various Topics Discussed at Meeting of Council Last Night.

Insurance matters, library subjects and plumbing ordinances were the chief topics of discussion and action at the council meeting last night, Secretary McCune of the Underwriters' Equitable rating bureau of this state appeared before the council in remonstrances to the new ordinance drafted and passed which taxes insurance companies \$25 annually. He affirmed that many of the companies would flatly refuse to pay the license and that the ratings in La Grande would immediately go up to meet this amount. It is estimated that the income to all insurance companies doing business here is \$30,000 and it would require about 8 per cent of this to meet the \$2,500 intended to be realized from the tax. Nothing definite was done except to discuss the situation from all its viewpoints. The secretary assured the council that if the city improved its fire department the rates would be lowered and also said that the companies would not pay the license, at least not without raising the rates here to meet the difference. Many companies, he said, did not get over \$150 out of the city annually.

The ordinance does not become operative until the 20th inst., and in the interim the fire and police committee will delve into the subject carefully.

The new plumbing ordinances were amended and passed.

Mayor Richardson, Councilmen Davis, Orvis, Mackey, Dunn, Church, Finley and Logsdon and City Attorney C. E. Cochran, were present when the council opened its proceedings.

The petition of Mrs. Zuber to be allowed the right to repair the wooden structure, known as the Keefer hotel, in the fire limits, damaged by the recent fire there, was discussed at some length. The fire committee's report was rejected, but final dispensation was laid on the table until the next meeting.

Library Site Discussed.

The report of the committee recommending the lot at the corner of Fourth and Pennsylvania be dedicated for library site purposes was unanimously adopted. The site is very satisfactory to the commission and to all followers of the new library. The location is so convenient to all concerned that scarcely a more suitable place could be found. It gives the commission something to work with and a long step toward realizing an up-to-date library had been taken.

Higher Wages Asked for.

City Treasurer Logan pointed out in a petition that the work of the treasurer has increased by a big figure since the improvement funds were created and he asks that the salary be raised to \$50 per month. At the same time City Auditor N. J. Mansager filed a petition setting out that the work has tripled of late and asks for a raise of \$20 monthly. Both were referred to the finance committee.

J. K. Wright's reimbursement was placed before the finance committee. A majority requested that he be reimbursed for city money lost by a bank failure.
