TAX LEVY FOR CITY 16 MILLS

MANY DIFFERENT FUNDS DRAW SHARE OF REVENUE.

Assessed Valuation Is Low, Bringing Levy High for the Year.

Sixteen mills is the levy fixed by the city council to meet the expenses of the municipality for the year 1912. This sum is divided into the various funds. Six mills of this is for the general fund and the bonded interest. Beaver creek sinking fund, park library and various other funds bring the total to 16 mills. The assessed valuation of the city's taxable property is \$2,759,061.00 and the 16 mill levy will bring a trifle more than \$27,000 in revenue.
