Local Elks to Take Part in Big Production Late in December.

Several, at least two or three of the larger stores, will keep open hours all week and some plan to open on Thursday evening and continuing for the week on week end schedules.

Jewelry stores will very probably be open all week nights, while grocery stores will continue until 9 o'clock from Thursday on.

No definite agreements have been reached on the closing hours from Christmas, though announcement for the grocery stores and meat shops will come in plenty of time to allow the housewives to replenish their larders in any event.

DRIVER DRAGGED UNDER SLEIGH

DAN HASBROUCK ESCAPES FATAL ACCIDENT.

Glass Hill Accident Miraculously Is Not Marred With Fatality.

Dan Hasbrouck miraculously escaped fatal injuries in a runaway accident on Glass Hill yesterday. As it was, he suffers with two broken ribs and is today "laid up" as a consequence. His team ran away coming down the steep mountain road when a load of wood on a drag sleigh pushed hard on the horses. He was caught under the poles that dragged on the ground at an angle from the front bob, and when the load finally tipped he was buried under the heavy wood. The accident was witnessed by Cleve Montgomery who was bringing down a load just ahead of the Hasbrouck load. Mr. Montgomery is still studying the details of the accident to determine how his companion escaped instant death. The driver was dragged a distance of 50 or 60 feet before the team was stopped but aside from this feature of the escape is the phase of his bearing the weight of the entire load of wood when it fell on him at the tipover.
