COUNCIL CLEANS UP ALL AFFAIRS

LAST MEETING OF IMPORTANCE A WEEK HENCE.

Many Routine Matters Came up for Consideration Last Night.

Granting or refusal of an increase in salaries for the treasurer and the city auditor will be left for the new administration to decide. The committee of the present council to which the petitions filed by Treasurer Logan and Auditor Manager a week ago, were referred last night failed to report either way on the petition. A long session will mean a large amount of routine business looking towards a cleaning up of the slate before the new administration takes charge, marked the meeting of the council last night at which Mayor Richardson, all councilmen, says Fleming, Recorder Humphreys and City Attorney Cochran were present. The budget of bills to which the committees had affixed their O. K.'s, were ordered paid. A petition for an arc light at the crest of the Sixth street hill was received and referred.

Petitions for water mains on U avenue from Fir to Spruce, and on First street from O to Spring were read and referred.

The bonding ordinances for floating bonds to cover the expenses of improvements to West Adams avenue and Lake street were passed.

Report of commissioners on the petition for a board walk on I avenue was read.

The matter of allowing the reconstruction or repair of the Hotel Keefe structure occupied considerable attention, the council taking the report of the committee from the table where it was placed a week ago, but after arguing the matter from its various standpoints the council re-referred it to the fire and police committee. Technical points as to the cost prevailing ordinances will permit expended on a reconstructed frame building in the fire limits is what is holding the issue at bay.

When the council adjourned it was to meet again next Wednesday which will be the last business session of this administration, the council meeting the following Monday to turn over affairs to the incoming mayor and council.

Various matters of more or less importance were discussed at length and by the end of the month the council will have all matters adjusted so that the new council can practically take over a clean sheet.
