## POST OFFICE OPEN SUNDAY

SPECIAL DISPENSATION MAKES THIS POSSIBLE.

One Hour on Sunday and One on Monday Is Order Issued Today.

Existing Sunday closing rules will be set aside next Sunday and Monday when the postoffice will be open, general delivery and city route windows, from 10 until 11 o'clock on Sunday. The following day will find similar arrangements so that it will be possible for belated Christmas packages to reach destination these two days. The Sunday closing law precludes any usual open city delivery windows on Sunday but by a special dispensation Postmaster Richie is able to accommodate the citizens by one hour on Sunday and one Monday.

Of course, there will be no carriers sent out either Sunday or Monday, and this refers to city and rural carriers alike.

### ORDINANCE NO. 581, SERIES 1911.

An ordinance authorizing the mayor and recorder of the city of La Grande to enter into a contract with H. G. H. Sutherland company for the construction of a sewer in section 2 of sewer district number three, in accordance with their bid now on file with the recorder of the city of La Grande Oregon.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the mayor and recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, be and they are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with the G. H. Sutherland company for the construction of a sewer in section 2 of sewer district No. 3, of the city of La Grande, Oregon, in accordance with their bid heretofore filed with the recorder and accepted by the council of the city of La Grande, Oregon.

### ORDINANCE NO. 580, SERIES 1911.

An ordinance authorizing the mayor and recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, to enter into a contract with John Mars for the macadamizing of North Fir street.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the mayor and recorder of the city of La Grande, Oregon, are hereby authorized to enter into a contract with John Mars for the macadamizing of North Fir street between the south curb line of Monroe avenue and the south curb line of U avenue, said work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore adopted for the erection of said improvement.

Section 2. Said contract shall be for a sum in accordance with the bid of the said John Mars heretofore received, and on file and accepted by the council for the doing of said work, and shall be for the furnishing of all the labor and material necessary for the completion of said improvement.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor and publication in one issue of the La Grande Evening Observer.
