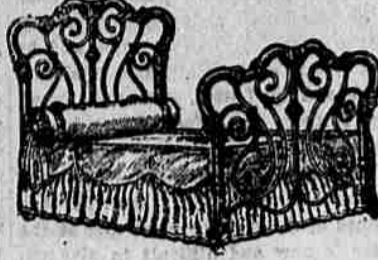

SAHLES PLEADS "NOT GUILTY"

MANSLAUGHTER CASE WILL COME UP NEXT TERM.

Two Men Headed for the Penitentiary Following Arraignments.

One manslaughter case, and a wheel stealing case are two pieces of litigation that will come up at the next term of circuit court. Several men indicted by the late grand jury were arraigned yesterday before Judge Knowles in circuit court and filed their answers. As a result two are headed for the state penitentiary and others are to stand trial. The manslaughter case is that of John Sahles who was seen by an eye witness to mortally wound a fellow being in a fight over 50 cents in a shack in North La Grande a few weeks ago. It was generally believed he would plead guilty and the case will probably hinge largely on the testimony of the boy who saw the blow struck that split open Fitzgerald's head, causing his death a few hours later. The murder was one of the most atrocious in the history of criminal acts in this county. The following were arraigned yesterday:

The Arraignments.

George Ward, whose real name is Whitaker, pleaded guilty to the larceny of a horse and was sentenced to the state prison for a term of from one to 10 years. He is the man who took the W. J. Church horse and drove to Baker, giving himself up there.

George Evans and Frank Smith, the latter asserting his correct name is Charles Smith, accused of stealing grain from T. T. Glenn, were arraigned. Evans pleaded not guilty and Smith refused to plead.

T. L. Gordon accused of complicity in the Love jewelry store robbery, pleaded guilty and was sentenced from two to five years.

John Sahles, accused of killing Fitzgerald in a drunken brawl a few weeks ago, pleaded not guilty.

Kamela, Dec. 27.—(Special)—Yuletide was appropriately observed at Kamela Sunday evening, with a program, tree and refreshments. An interesting program was rendered to a very large audience, which was followed by the appearance of Old Santa on the scene, who had presents of all kinds for everyone. 3-FLOOR BRICK IS OCCUPIED

F. D. HAISTEN HAS MODERN ADDITION READY.

Basement, Main Floor and Gallery Gives Him Modern Establishment.

ORDINANCE NO. 583, SERIES 1911.

An ordinance amending ordinance number 569, series 1911, and providing for the re-numbering of the bonds authorized by said ordinance for bonded assessments in improvement districts numbers 36, 37, 38 and 39, and for the improvement of Sixteenth Street, in Connordale addition to the city of La Grande, Oregon.

The city of La Grande does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That section 1 of ordinance number 569, series 1911, be and the same is hereby amended as to the numbering of said bonds to read as follows:

Said bonds shall be numbered from 267 to 289, both inclusive, consecutively, and shall be in denominations of \$500.00 each, except bond No. 289, which shall be for the sum of \$378.97.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage, approval by the mayor and one publication in the La Grande Evening Observer, on and after the second day of January, 1912.

Passed the common council of the city of La Grande, this 27th day of December, 1911, by five councilmen voting therefor.

Approved by the mayor this 28th day of December, 1911.

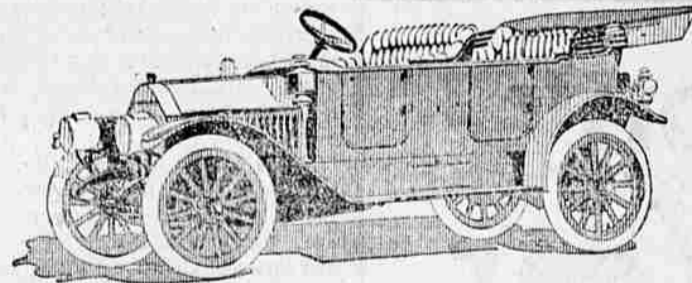
