U. S. Circuit Courts No More.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 30.—The United States circuit courts, which have constituted an important part of the federal judiciary system for nearly a century past, cease their existence today. The passing of these courts, 27 in number and covering the entire country, is one of the reforms provided for in the new judiciary code enacted by congress on March 3 last, to become effective January 1, 1912. The existence of the circuit courts since 1891 when the circuit courts of appeal were created, has been regarded as superfluous and expensive. The circuit judges do not lose their positions by the change, as they will continue to sit in the circuit courts of appeal and help in the district courts.

Washington, D. C., Jan. 1.—Inspectors of the bureau of chemistry, under the supervision of Dr. Harvey W. Wiley, the pure food expert, collected 9,500 samples of foods and drugs during the past year, according to the report of the bureau just made public. Of the 9,500 foods and drugs seized the bureau found only 3,280 to be legal as compared with 3,113 which were found to be misbranded and adulterated. Five hundred and three check analyses were made to insure that correct results were obtained before recommendations were made as to the method of procedure by the department for the violations.

There were 5,370 hearings held by the bureau on questionable products, of which over half were made made at New York. A total of 9,699 imported foods and drugs were analyzed and 3,085 were found adulterated or misbranded. The miscellaneous samples which come under the examination of the pure food expert's aggregated 1,406, making a total of 18,000 samples.

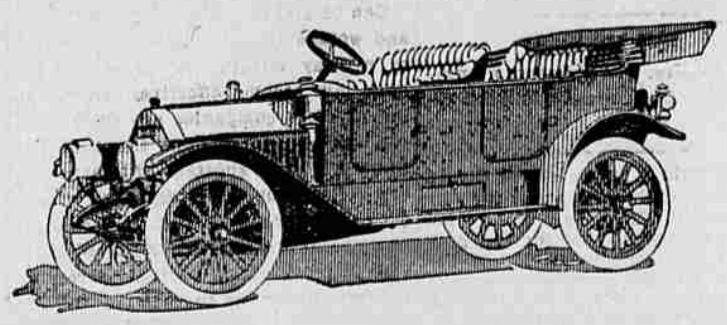
