

RECORD SNOW PERIOD LIKELY ICE HOUSES ON O-W FILLING UP

DEPTH AND DURATION ALREADY PAST USUAL.

Cold Snap Moderates Rapidly and Elegant Sleighing Prevails.

Record duration of sufficient snow to allow excellent sleighing this winter is the prediction of wise owls and seers into the future climatic conditions. Commencing earlier by almost a month than usual and splendidly founded on frozen ground the present snowfall gives every prospect of lasting for some time. Even at this early date good sleighing prevails over a big territory and during a longer period of time than in any past season of recent years. A record breaker is no doubt in store this winter.

On a community that already boasted of deep, well packed snow, another consignment of silvery covering fell last night and today improving if such a thing is possible, the existing running conditions. No drifts prevail anywhere principally on account of the slow degrees by which the original snow fell and the abundant moisture in it.

That the cold snap was destined to be a feeler is further indicated by the fact that atmospheric conditions continue to moderate rapidly, yet the snow is not endangered by the rise in temperature.

SNOW AREA LARGE.

Rev. H. S. Shangle, presiding elder for the local district of the Methodist church, South, arrived this morning from Boise where he was called on clerical affairs. PACIFIC EXPRESS COMPANY LAYING UP STOCK.

Big Plant at North Powder to Be Iceing Station Hereafter.

Pacific Fruit Express company ice houses in Eastern Oregon are being filled with the annual supply. The North Powder plant, one of the very largest in the state and built last year and now operated by the Pacific Express is the first to be filled. The capacity of that plant is enormous and as a consequence overland fruit cars are to be led there in the future. This will become an important adjunct to the business at North Powder, requiring a considerable force of men during the fruit shipping season which really is all summer long. Huntington and La Grande ice houses owned by the same company are to be filled at once. The gateway house is the more elaborate of the two for at La Grande 600 tons is all that is put up, although it is a considerable quantity. This is not to be confused with the icing of Pullmans, however, as that will continue to be necessary both at La Grande and Huntington, though on a more extensive basis at Huntington. The North Powder headquarters are the outcomer of the plant owned by Andrew Lam previously, but purchased from him last year and remodelled and enlarged. The ice is cut and put up at North Powder on almost gigantic scales.

VALLEY HORSES SOLD.

Two Carloads Purchased by Willamette Valley and Portland Buyers.

Two carloads of horses have been bought up in Union county during the past few days and considerable money is brought into the county as a result in view of the fact that all the horses taken away commanded good prices.

Wallace McClain and Mr. Halley, both of Newberg, have just completed the purchase of a carload of horses in the Cove district and are going to ship out tomorrow. G. W. Howell of Portland has bought a carload from W. D. Grandy of this city, and he, too, will ship out tomorrow which is regular stock train day.

Wife of Former Councilman of This City Passes Away at Portland.

Word received yesterday evening from Portland states that Mrs. Tom Fleming died at the hospital there yesterday afternoon.
